I 18th Nebraska State Convention One for the Record Books

The 2023 Nebraska State Convention, held at the Younes Center in Kearney on April 28-30, was an event for the record books. If you were not able to attend, you missed an enjoyable weekend filled with renewing old friendships, making new ones, socializing, emotional presentations, and many awards.

Friday was filled with meetings, and the evening social set the mood for a festive Awards Banquet. Awards were presented to a record 73 different Councils. Council awards were chosen by the State Officers and Directors from the 672 ICC submissions received from the Councils. There were also awards for membership, funds collected through the One Rose One Life and the Intellectual Disability (Tootsie Roll) programs, as well as Chaplain (Fr. Matthew Kovar), District Deputy (Jesse Hines), Rookie Knight (Logan Erickson), and

Knight (Harold Nielsen) of the Year. A complete list of all the awards can be found on pages 8 and 9.

Special recognition was also given to Field Agent Deacon Bill Buchta, as he retires after more than 30 years of service. The evening concluded with music, drinks, socializing and a special visit from some "Hawaiian dressed dancers" in the Hospitality room!

Saturday morning started with the Past State Deputy and Former Chaplain Breakfast. There were also meetings held for specially appointed Delegates representing Councils from throughout Nebraska. Holy Hour was held with the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament followed by the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

August of 1999. I vividly remember packing up my '91 Dodge Shadow in Auburn and getting ready to fire it up and move to UNL for my Freshman year college studies. I was pumped to finally have my "freedom." I was ready to be an adult.

As I backed that little stuffed car out of the driveway, I saw Mom and Dad on the front porch---Mom crying and Dad holding her---both waving their goodbyes to their third-born son. In my first act of being an adult, I found a lump in my throat and a mist in my eye like a little baby. A flood of emotions hit me as I drove down 16th Street for the last time as a kid and turned north on Highway 75 into adulthood. Trying to act like a "grown man," I choked back the tears forming, cleared my throat, and turned on some Chris LeDoux on the CD player.

The memory of my folks on that porch is etched in my mind. And every time I leave the old two-bedroom home in Auburn, Mom still waves goodbye to me from the large front window. Dad passed in September of 2020. And it still gets to me at age 42.

I suppose all of us can replay moments like this one. I guess as my journey with you as State Chaplain comes to an end, this is the image that comes to my mind. In a way, I think it is fitting---I wonder if our past years' patron, St. Joseph, experienced similar "so-longs" with Jesus and Mary.

We should always remember that everything we do as Knights materially is derivative of our spiritual belief that God became man so that man could become God. Jesus took on our mortal flesh so that we could be lifted up by His Sacraments and elevated to a life of grace and Eternal Life. No matter where we go as Knights, may we remember this reality...that doing good and being kind does not get us to Heaven...but a life lived in His Sacraments and in His Church does get us to Heaven.

Be proud of who you are...you are all children of God. You have a Church to pray for..... and you have a Church that prays for you.

It has been an honor to serve you as State Chaplain. Thank you for allowing me to walk with you these past couple of years.

As in previous years, ALL money collected and

your report form must be turned in to the Intellectual Disabilities Foundation Directors by January 31, 2024. Your council may request up to 50% of your funds collected to be sent back to qualifying organizations of your choice and all requests must be received in writing by June 30, 2024.

The Intellectual Disabilities Foundation will be providing more information in the coming months related to other program activities such as Special Olympics and Project Lori, as well as sharing the stories of the organizations and people that we serve throughout the state. Please be on the lookout for this information and share it with your council and community so we can showcase the good works we do.

While the 2022-2023 drive was a huge success for the Intellectual Disabilities Foundation, we can always do better. For the 2023-2024 Campaign, we are hoping to raise over \$200,000.

This will only be possible with the hard work and creative ideas of each of our councils. If the candy distribution does not work for you, we are happy to help with new ideas to raise funds for this worthy cause. What is per capita? Where does it go? How much is it? Where do the assessed numbers come from? These are some of the frequently asked questions when it comes to the per capita billing. Following are answers to each of these questions. Hopefully this will help everyone understand the per capita assessment.

What is per capita?

Per capita is an assessment on every member of the Knights of Columbus in all jurisdictions. Only Disabled and Honorary Life members are excluded from this yearly per capita assessment. Both the State Council and Supreme have a per - capita assessments.

Where does the money go?

The state assessment is designed to assist the State Council in funding items such as programs, conventions, Knights Courier, and the other expenses that are associated with running an organization like ours. Your State Council does not have other fund-raising programs to pay the general expenses of the State Council. Fund raisers such as Tootsie Roll Drive, Buck-a-month, One Rose – One Life, and the Vocation Lottery all go to the Foundations that promote them for their use and that of the local Councils.

How much is it?

State per capita assessment

Your state per capita invoice is received two times each fiscal year. Invoices are sent directly to your council's Financial Secretary and are to be paid from your council's annual dues. Starting the 2023 Fraternal year, \$10.75 per member is assessed by the State Council and is your council's State per capita billing. One part will be billed July 1, 2023, and due by September 1, 2023, for \$5.88 per member. The remainder will be billed \$5.87 per member on January 1, 2024, and due by March 1, 2024.

Supreme per capita assessment

Supreme's per capita assessment is currently \$4.50 per member per billing (twice yearly) and is your council's Supreme per capita billing. These invoices need to be downloaded from the Supreme website as Supreme no longer mails the assessments to the Councils.

Where do the assessed numbers come from?

For both per capita invoices, the State Council uses the number of members that each council has on Supremes membership roster as of July 1st of that current fiscal year. This is another reason why it is important that your council's Financial Secretary accurately maintains and updates your membership records with Supreme.


