


Inaugural State Pro Life Gala Dinner and Dance

Lent: A Blessed Gift

In the instruction for the First Degree, we are introduced to the Latin expression, "Memento mori," "Remember death." It is a sobering reminder that our lives on this earth are a gift that will have an expiration, and the future life depends on what we do with our lives here. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that we must persevere in faith and in the grace of Christ to the time of death to receive eternal life and the glory of heaven.

I have the privilege of teaching the course on the Catechism to the seminarians this year. It has brought some of the teachings to a new focus. Some that have had a particularly strong impact this year include that sin is an offense against God and is incompatible with our life in Christ. That absolute statement gives no allowance for some sins when we are doing other things that are good.

The Catechism also teaches that the gift of Baptism, which gives us God's life in us sanctifying grace, we still have the effects of Original Sin--of weakness of human nature and the inclination to sin, concupiscence, such our lives are a struggle of conversion directed toward holiness in which we must prove ourselves, though always having the help of the grace of Christ. (CCC # 1426) It is a struggle

we must engage in even though we may fall short and sin.

The holy season of Lent is a gift to us to help us identify the ways we may have given ourselves permission to be less faithful in living the way of our Lord, to repent of those with sorrow and rejection of sin, especially through a good Confession, and to embrace the work of a new conversion of the pattern of our lives through penance.

Our penance is first of all internal as we turn from sin, but we carry it out in external acts that can include our Lenten efforts such as deeper and more committed prayer, fasting and other self-denial, and almsgiving and extending ourselves and resources in charity and mercy.

This has prompted me to take my Lent more seriously this

year because it is serious. I hope this Lent will be a blessing for you as well.

As a Knight and member of St. Teresa's Council in Lincoln, I'm happy to join you in this fine publication by offering a brief "Legislative Corner" to help you stay up to date on public policy matters in Nebraska.

Allow me to introduce myself. I'm the Executive Director of the Nebraska Catholic Conference. The NCC represents the three Bishops of Nebraska on their mutual public policy interests. Our daily mission is to engage, educate, and empower public officials, the Catholic faithful, and the general public on our public policy priorities. While we work on both federal and state public policy issues, our main focus is on the Nebraska State Legislature. It's important and fulfilling work.

As Knights and Catholics, we are called to faithful citizenship. This is embodied in the Knights' fourth principle of patriotism. It is a call, rooted in our baptism, to be leaven in our state's and country's political life. As the NCC's vision statement states, we are called to "bear the light of Christ in the public square."

In this "Legislative Corner," my hope is to update you on

important pieces of state legislation where we need Knights to step up to the plate and be advocates. This might be on matters protecting unborn life, supporting mothers in need, advancing religious liberty, defending marriage and the family, assisting the poor, among so many other issues.

I also hope to update you on other critical matters. For example, there is currently a ballot initiative process underway by pro-abortion advocates to enshrine abortion rights up until birth into our state constitution. This effort is similar to those in Ohio and Michigan. It is a frightening proposal and needs to be defeated.

Having recently been a part of the Good News Marriage Cruise certainly made us think of the parallel between Marriage and the Eucharist. In addition to daily Mass and confessions on the ship, there was an amazing community of couples and speakers including Father Mike Schmitz and Dr Ray Guarendi.

The Good News Cruise was crafted to facilitate an encounter with our spouse and with Christ. We felt at home on the Cruise especially with the 831 passengers who wore the special Good News Cruise lanyard, about 1/3 of the ship.

Our shared beliefs and mutual goals for a better marriage and a closer and deeper understanding of our Lord in the Eucharist created a natural bond. Marriage is, after all, for the married person an opportunity to spread and experience Christ's love on a daily basis. The chance to strengthen this commitment with others who share this goal made it more fun and attainable.

Other passengers who were not part of the Good News group were intrigued and wanted to know more about us. What an incredible opportunity as we explained the focus of our journey which often led to sharing plans of the upcoming Eucharistic Pilgrimage.

Kathy and I began our relationship at Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas 55 years ago and subsequently married after graduation in 1972. We look forward to returning there on June 25, 2024, for a Eucharistic Pilgrimage stop and Mass at the College. After an overnight stay, we plan to continue the pilgrimage into Missouri and ultimately Indianapolis, IN. Some of the ship's passengers are planning to join us at the Mass in Atchison.

Another nugget we found was through meeting a couple who are associated with Divine Mercy Radio in Hays, Kansas. It confirmed to us that Catholic Radio is an indisputable way to evangelize. This, after all, is the purpose of the Eucharistic Revival and an answer to Christ's commission to each of us to spread the Good News. We invite everyone to listen to

When our Lord Jesus was a carpenter, he probably had a set of tools: hammer, chisel, wood knife, square, etc. You can imagine he took very good care of these tools because they helped him make a living and put food on the table. You can imagine St. Joseph taught him to care for these tools and why that was important. In your job, you use tools, physical or mental, that help you be successful. Lack of the right tools makes any job harder. The harder the job, the less likely you may be to continue.

Shouldn't you have a set of tools for your spiritual life? Shouldn't you keep those tools sharp and clean? Wouldn't it be good to acquire new tools once in a while to make it better? Hopefully your answer to each of these questions was yes.

COR is such a tool and a place to meet with fellow Catholic men who are on a journey to Heaven. It's a place to learn more about our Catholic faith and God's love for each of us. It's a place to find support when times are tough or when the tools may become dull or broken. It's a place to share your journey with others and to join hands and hearts

in moving toward a true relationship with our Lord.

Fr. McGivney knew that for the Catholic faith to remain strong, it needed to be based in the family; that by building the Domestic Church, the Universal Church would be stronger. He knew by building strong family leaders, the parish and community would be stronger. The COR process has been developed to provide opportunities for Catholic men to build fraternity, form their faith, and develop or expand their prayer life in support of their roles as leaders.

You can start, or expand your COR program by selecting your leaders. The resources on the Supreme (kofc.org/cor) and State (nebraskakofc.org/programs/evangelization-and-faith-formation) websites can help facilitate your sessions.

Grab the tools God has given you to serve others and guide them to Christ our Savior.

Intellectual Disabilities Foundation Updates "Helping People with Special Needs"

The 2023 Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities was another successful year. The organizations across Nebraska received tremendous support from our councils, and we fulfilled many organization's requests for funds. We are excited to present the awards to the councils who excelled by increasing their total funds raised again this year. To all councils that participated and reported this year, thank you for your hard work.

As we finish processing the information for the 2023 campaign, we need to start looking at the 2024 campaign. This fall's drive will take place over the weekend of October 10-13. Now is the time to start thinking about ways to increase your fundraising whether through candy distribution, hosting a breakfast or some other method. Every council should run a fundraiser and report. We will be happy to help any council looking for ideas. We also want to encourage you to reach out to your local government (mayor, city council, etc.) and request a proclamation to further support your fall campaign and increase awareness for your drive.

If your council will be doing candy distribution this fall, you can begin thinking about your orders. Group orders are still the best method for candy orders with free shipping (obtained on orders of 33 cases or more). No orders under 18 cases will be accepted. Please also note that candy deliveries must be made to a business address.

This year's candy bars have a new, updated shape and wrapper, which require the <u>NEW ORDER FORM</u> to be used when ordering the candy. This new form will be available on the State Council website. A copy for each council will be available this summer. Orders placed on old forms may be delayed or unfulfilled, so please be sure to utilize the new form. The cost and quantities of each case will remain the same.





Project Lori was another huge success this year. With over \$13,000 raised, we were able to support wish-list items for five organizations across Nebraska. Mosaic in Central Nebraska (serving the areas of Grand Island, Hastings and Kearney), Mosaic in Southeast Nebraska (serving Lincoln and Beatrice), Villa Marie in Waverly, Madonna School and Community Based Services in Omaha, and Buckboard Therapeutic Riding Academy in Gering all received necessary supplies to help their programs run and enhance the lives of hundreds of individuals this Christmas season. Information for Project Lori 2024 will be coming out in the next few months. We hope to grow the program even more this holiday season.

The Knights of Columbus were also honored to serve as the title sponsor for the Villa Marie Fundraiser, "Shining Like His Stars" in February. This is our second year as title sponsor for this tremendous event. For the third consecutive year, members of the State Family also participated in the Polar Plunge in support of Special Olympics Nebraska. The Knights are pleased to announce that our 2023 Soccer Challenge has produced another International Award Winner.



As State Secretary, I look forward to seeing you in Kearney April 26-28, 2024. Here are two items your Council needs to do in order to fully participate in this year's Annual State Convention.

1. Pay Council Per Capita by April 15, 2024

If your Council has not paid their **Supreme and State Per Capita** assessments, your delegates will not be seated for the business sessions which denies your Council the right to vote on ANY State Council matter. Please ensure your Council is in good standing. If you are unsure of your Council's Per Capita status, contact me at 402.651.9840.

2. Submit Council Delegate Credentials by April 15, 2024

Your Council must submit their delegate credentials. Councils are encouraged to complete an on-line delegate credential via a link at www.nebraskakofc.org by April 15, 2024. If sending paper credentials, they must be sent to State Secretary Mike Schaeffer, 4306 Sheridan Rd, Bellevue NE 68123 and received by April 15, 2024. Meeting the April 15 deadline gives me time to process the forms. On this form, you will list your delegates and alternates, which allows them to be seated and grants them voting privileges on matters that come before the membership. This is the last year paper credentials will be accepted as we're moving to all on-line delegate credentials for the April 2025 State Convention.

Your Financial Secretary should have received the online delegate credential link and paper delegate credential forms in a packet from State Executive Secretary Ray Guggenberger in February. Make sure that when your delegates arrive, they sign in at the delegate check-in station, immediately inside the main entrance. This will ensure the business session role call process goes smoothly both days. The delegates need to be present for both business sessions to receive their mileage and per diem check. Every 3rd Degree member of the Nebraska Knights of Columbus is eligible to represent the State Council as a delegate to the 142nd Supreme Convention in **Quebec City**, **Canada**, August 5-8, 2024. If you are interested in running for a Supreme delegate, contact your financial secretary. Nominations are due April 27th by the close of the business meeting.

Important Supreme Delegate Information

- You must have a current passport that does not expire prior to January 5, 2025.
- You will have to pay all your expenses, such as travel, hotels and meals. The State cannot help. You will receive a mileage and Per Diem check on the last day of the convention. Details will be sent to the delegate when approved.
- You must be a 3rd Degree Member, and you must have a credit card.
- You must stay in the convention hotel, and you must attend all business meetings.
- You must attend the Supreme Council Annual State's Dinner, and you will need a white dinner jacket. Most rent one. The cost of the delegate's dinner will be deducted from their mileage and Per Diem check.
- You must pay for your spouse's dinner when completing your registration.
- The State Council will host a dinner Wednesday evening. The State Council will pay for your (and your spouse's) meal(s). The Nebraska Bishops also attend.


