#### Sharing the Eucharist

There's a lot of excitement in the Church in the United States as we gear up for the Eucharistic Congress this summer. The last two years of preparation have helped us grow in understanding of the truth of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as well as appreciation for that great gift which is at the center of our life as Catholics. Some have attributed the increased numbers of people who were received into the Church this year at the Easter Vigil to the increased appreciation for and honor given to the Holy Eucharist.

The Catholic Church would not be the Catholic Church without the Eucharist. We would not have His life in us. We would not have His abiding presence in this world because He dwells in our churches in the Tabernacle. The sacrifice of Christ on Calvary would be only a past event if it were not made present once again in every Mass that is offered. We rely on the Mass and the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to make His saving mysteries present to us so that we have a living encounter with Him when we participate in the Mass. No wonder that the Church in official documents speaks of the Holy Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life.

As Jesus comes across our country in four Eucharistic processions heading to the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, we will have a rare opportunity to greet Him along the way. He will have a number of stops in Nebraska, and He will visit each of the three dioceses. Please plan to take part in some of the events that will be held for the procession and maybe to participate in the Eucharistic Congress.

On the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, also known as Corpus Christi, celebrated this year on June 2, there is a custom of having processions with the Blessed Sacrament. Some parishes will have their own processions, and other larger events are also being planned. We can publicly bear witness to our faith in Jesus' Real Presence

in the Blessed Sacrament and show our love for Him by participating in these events.

### Robert H. Ostdiek, A Life Legacy of Service

Robert H. Ostdiek, who passed away on April 19, 2024, spent his life of nearly 91 years serving God, his family and his community. Born on May 2, 1933, in Lawrence, NE, to Hubert and Louise Ostdiek, he was the fifth of 13 children.

He earned a BA and MA in mathematics and education. He worked as an educator and

administrator in several Eastern Nebraska communities, as well serving in the Army ROTC program. He was commissioned in 1955 and served in the Army Reserves for 8 years.

He met Janet Johnston in 1957 and the couple married in 1959. While they lived in several communities, they moved to Gretna in 1960 where they raised their nine children.

Thanks to his father's purchase of the Lawrence Locomotive weekly newspaper in 1943 which grew to include six

Nebraska community weekly papers, Bob and his siblings learned the business of newspaper publishing. The Gretna community approached him to begin a weekly newspaper. The result was the Gretna Guide and News which served the community for 60 years.

He also served on a number of community and school boards and foundations. Wherever he saw a need, he tried to find a solution. He led fundraising efforts, community projects and drives. In 2015, he was recognized as Gretna Citizen of the Year.

One of his favorite organizations was the Knights of Columbus, which he joined on his 18th birthday. He remained active in the organization his entire life. He helped charter the Papillion-Gretna council and later the Gretna council. Bob held many leadership positions including Nebraska State Deputy (1990-1992), District Master (1995-1999) and was elected to the Supreme officer position of Warden (1991-1993).

Several of his sons, nephews and grandsons have also become members of the Knights and continue the Ostdiek legacy of service.



### Eucharistic Revival - Eucharistic Congress - Eucharistic Procession

We began taking our Lord Jesus Christ to the streets on the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 19, 2022. For a year, dioceses worked to strengthen and deepen their devotion, love, and relationship with Christ. In June 2023, parishes began bringing the Eucharistic Revival to their congregations through adoration, exposition, missions, pilgrimages, and many other events designed to help everyone begin, or strengthen, their walk with Christ.

In 2024, we have another opportunity to take Christ to the streets and walk with Him through Eucharistic Processions. Where did Jesus do most of His teaching? In towns, in villages, in fields, and as he walked with His disciples from place to place. Now is our unique chance to walk with Jesus, to learn from Him, to encounter Him, and to grow closer to Him. Think about the Gospel story of the two disciples recounting their encounter with Christ on the road to Emmaus: "Were not our hearts burning?" Christ's disciples did not know what would happen as they walked with Jesus, but they were drawn to Him. They knew their hearts were burning. Now it is our chance.

Beginning on May 17, 2024, four routes will cross the United States, ending in Indianapolis, IN, the week of June 17 - 24 at the National Eucharistic Congress. We in

Nebraska are blessed to be part of the St. Junipero Serra route that will leave the Archdiocese of San Francisco on May 17 and wind through Nevada, Oregon, Idaho, Utah, and Colorado before making 26 stops across Nebraska. Each of our dioceses will have opportunities to participate in this great outward show of faith. You can find the details of each stop on nebraskakofc.org. Norfolk

We encourage every Knight, their families, and friends to participate in this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. Councils and Assemblies will be receiving additional information about how they can participate. Spend time with our Lord, for a few minutes, an hour, a day. Let your heart be open to know Christ more fully and to know His True Presence in the Holy Eucharist that was given to us at the Last Supper and is with us every minute of every hour of every day. Come and be fed like the five thousand – not with fishes and loaves, but with the true Body and Blood of Christ.



This husband-and-wife team also have a blended family of 5 children, and 2 grandchildren. One of their son's is in his 8th year of seminary and they look forward to his ordination. This Knight and his wife have provided support and a loving environment while he navigates his calling. This son will be the first priest from the parish in 50 years.




