Brothers,

As you are aware, to qualify for the Founder's Award (and Star Council), a council must host and/or promote two Benefit Nights during this fraternal year. This is in lieu of getting an insurance quota on membership. Your Field Agent will be helping to organize these Benefit Nights, and the first one is scheduled for the evening of Thursday, September 17 at 7 PM CDT. This for all councils in the State.

This will be a Zoom meeting with special guest, Tom Hegna. Tom is an economist, author, and retirement expert, and is considered by many to be "The Retirement Income Expert!"

This is a great church project since the council can open this event up to the parish. After hearing this presentation, we potentially may see more men interested in joining your council.

At a minimum, the council does have to promote this event and have at least one member in attendance in order for it to count toward the Founder's Award. Promotion can be as little as sending out a mass email to your members. However, the more you promote this the better as Tom has wonderful advice for all. Other ideas for promotion are:

- Doing a pulpit announcement at Mass
- Doing an e-mail campaign to the parish, with the help of the parish office.
- Put an announcement in the council bulletin.
- Put an announcement in the church bulletin.
- Hang informational flyers in the church and church hall.

As with anything, please be sure to get your chaplain's approval before promoting anything that involves the parish roster and or facility (parish email blast, hanging flyers in the church, having a group event, etc).

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE PROGRAM

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program began in 1960 as a project of the Knights of Columbus Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of **Our Lady of Guadalupe**, **Patroness of the Americas**. The program has continued since then as a project in most Knights of Columbus jurisdictions.

From early March through mid-December, Silver Roses are stewarded by Knights of Columbus councils along routes from Canada to Mexico. Every stop the Silver Rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners and community members to pray for respect for life, for the spiritual renewal of each nation, and for the advancement of the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

This year these prayer services will be live-streamed while the transfer of the rose will be face-to-face, with Supreme supplying disinfectives, gloves and face masks.

A Silver Rose "honoring Our Lady of Guadalupe and reaffirming our commitment to the sanctity of human life" is carried by Knights from Canada, through the United States, and into Mexico to arrive at the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. 

Memorials


