Words from our State Chaplain

Lent

If any of you or your loved ones have been faced with a serious, even life-threatening illness or surgery, most likely you did whatever was possible and reasonable to meet and conquer that challenge.

Even if a physical or mental malady requires treatment such as chemotherapy or months long inactivity and physical and/or occupational therapy or counseling following surgery or an unexpected challenge, I believe most of us would follow such regimens that allow us to get back on our feet, to resume a normal life and to give us at least a few more years on this earth. We will do whatever is necessary to achieve these goals.

Lent is a season which the Church gives us to do these very things - to rid us of what might hinder a deeper relationship with our Lord and to prepare us for the next life – a life measured beyond the limits of time and space. Lent actually means "springtime," a season of new beginnings. That is what I hope Lent will be for each of you this year - a time of new beginnings marked by ridding ourselves of those things which are harmful and to accept the Lord and the grace of His sacraments into our lives.

Ideas

Allow me to offer four initiatives that may make the rest of your Lent productive and fruitful for you. They are not necessarily original and certainly are not inclusive and/or exhaustive. I offer them from my own personal experience.

New Testament

Resolve to read the New Testament. The New Testament consists of 27 works - Gospels, books, letters or epistles. If a person were able, he or she could easily read the entire New Testament in 24 hours. It is in the New Testament that we encounter Jesus of Nazareth and understand the incredible sacrifices He made for us. I believe some people go through their entire lives without ever reading the Bible. Don't be one of those people.

Rerouting

Read Father John Riccardo's most recent book, *Rerouting*. One of the most popular priest preachers/evangelists, Father Riccardo lays out a roadmap of what it takes to be a missionary disciple of Jesus today. A small book, it is an easy read and can easily be the subject of a small faith-based book study.

Eucharistic Adoration

Spend one hour each week in Eucharistic Adoration in the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle. Many graces will come to those who place themselves in front of Jesus and asked Him to speak to them. I assure you, great graces and consolation will come to those who do so. Try Saturday or Sunday. Usually those days afford us the time to do so.

Technology

Now - for the hardest suggestion - have a complete blackout on all technology during the remaining days of Lent. Don't say it cannot be done. It can be, but it will hurt. It will hurt more for young people because they are natives to the digital world whereas someone like me (age 57) is an immigrant to the digital world. Our lives are dominated by noise - usually delivered by technology. Just think how much time we spend on technology every day – YouTube, Twitter, Facebook, television, blogs of our choice, newsfeeds, radio, texting, and on and on and on.

COUNCIL PER CAPITA MUST BE PAID

First, if you have not paid your supreme and state per capita assessments, your delegates will not be seated, which in turn denies your council a vote or votes in ANY State Council matters. It would be a shame not to be able to fully participate, so please make sure your council is in good standing. If you are unsure of your council's status, please feel free to contact me.

SUBMIT COUNCIL CREDENTIALS BY APRIL 15

Another must is your council's credentials. I must receive this form by April 15 for processing. On this form, you will list your delegates and alternates, which allows them to be seated and grants them voting privileges on matters that come before the membership. Your Financial Secretary should have received these credential forms in a packet from State Executive Secretary Ray Guggenberger in January. **Make sure that when your delegates arrive, they sign in at the delegate check-in station right inside the entrance. This is very important to help the roll call process go smoothly! Your delegate needs to be present for both business sessions or you will not receive your mileage and per diem check.** Please contact me with any questions or concerns. BE A SUPREME DELEGATE

Supreme Convention - Minneapolis, MN - August 6-8, 2019

Every 3rd Degree member of the Nebraska Knights of Columbus is eligible to represent the State Council as a delegate to the 136th Supreme Convention in Minneapolis, MN, August 6-8, 2019. If you are interested in running for Supreme Delegate, contact your Financial Secretary.

Mandatory for a Supreme Delegate: You will have to pay all expenses such as travel, hotels, and meals yourself. The State cannot help you. You will receive a reimbursement check at noon on Thursday, August 8. Delegates are reimbursed at the rate of \$400 per diem for lodging and meals and paid \$.30 per mile for the first 1,500 miles and \$.20 per mile over 1,500 miles.

- You must be a 3rd Degree member.
- You must have a credit card.
- You will need a white dinner jacket. Most rent one.
- You must attend the Annual (Supreme Council) States' Dinner on Tuesday evening. The cost of the delegate's dinner will be deducted from your reimbursement check. You must pay for your spouse's dinner when completing your registration.
- You must stay in the convention hotel.
- You must attend all business meetings.
- The State Council will host a dinner Wednesday evening. The State Council will pay for your (and spouse's) meal. The Nebraska Bishops also attend.



In 1986, Luis was a founding member of the Bill Morton International Brotherhood of Magicians Ring. He held position of President of this Ring for seven terms. From 1989 to 1998, Luis and Rogene Villamonte performed magic professionally, averaging around 300 shows year.



Magician[™], a thriving computer business he continues to run today. Luis is a Microsoft Certified Systems Engineer, and with his wife, Rogene, and the staff at TCM designs, he implements, and manages network infrastructures for small businesses in Lincoln and Omaha.

In 2001, Luis launched MagicKits.com. Today, this website generates millions of hits a month and ships magic kits all over the world. Luis created, designed, and helped in manufacturing 24 "house brand" magic kits as well. His site has over 200 different magic kits available during the Christmas gift season.

Over the years, Luis has been a mentor to several students, with many of them helping manage his shows and performing with him on stage. In 2002, he collaborated to form the Magic Mafia with three of his former students. Two members are still performing professionally today.

Considered the "Godfather" of the Magic Mafia group, Luis enjoys helping young people learn the art of magic. Chase Hasty, his most recent student from Holdrege NE, signed a nine



month contract to headline with the SandCastle Magic Show in Guam for the 2019 season.



Jim Bertrand and the Shroud of Turin

Jim Bertrand has been on the road these past four years, sharing the message of the Holy Shroud to some 13,000 people, across 13 different dioceses, in eight states. Being a science teacher for the past 38 years, he has a keen interest in the Shroud of Turin. He was the first member of The American Confraternity of the Holy Shroud to receive certification as a qualified presenter on the Holy Shroud.

His presentation is a summary of the recently-completed, and widely acclaimed book, The Shroud of Turin, A Critical Summary, by Dr. John P. Jackson of Colorado Springs. For those who don't have the time to read through 50 years of research, his presentation lays this out in a very organized way so that people can evaluate the scientific findings on the Shroud, and come to their own reasoned judgement regarding its authenticity.

Bertrand's Powerpoint presentation has been wellreceived in the many diverse settings it has been given, including the Eucharistic Convention in Auckland, New Zealand in 2016. He's also presented to universities, churches, schools around the United States, and both men's and women's state prisons in Lincoln and York, Nebraska.

According to Jim, "The presentation to the women in prison at York, was one of the more memorable times for me because these women saw the Shroud as visible proof of the hope in the Resurrection. Their faces brightened up and they were extremely happy and hopeful to be made aware of the Shroud. They are living through their own 'Good Friday' right now, but the Shroud gave them a very real and tangible hope for their future - which comes with our own Resurrection. They look forward to their own 'Easter Sunday' which still lies ahead."

Jim grew up in North Platte, graduated from St. Patrick High School, and graduated from the University of Nebraska with his B.S. Degree in Biology in 1981. He went on to earn his Masters Degree in Secondary Education in 1987. He and his wife have been married 35 years and have six children ages 18 to 33.

Jim often says, "The Shroud is for everyone, because the Resurrection is for everyone."

Cure of Ars Heart Visits All Three Nebraska Diocese

Knights of Columbus Holding Nationwide Tour

LINCOLN (SNR) – The major relic of St. Jean Vianney's incorrupt heart will be at the Cathedral of the Risen Christ in Lincoln March 20.

The Shrine of Ars, France, entrusted the relic to the Knights of Columbus for a national tour in the United States, now underway through early June 2019.

In Catholic tradition, a relic is an object associated with a saint that may be offered to the faithful for veneration. The soul of a saint is united with God in heaven, so an object associated with a saint is meant to draw a person closer to God. Neither the relic nor the saint is to be worshipped.

"A relic is venerated in recognition of the fact that God has worked through a saint, and that an object associated with a saint is holy and can lead us to God," the Knights of Columbus website explains. "The healing power of relics comes from God alone and never from the object."

"Reference to an early form of relics can be found in the New Testament, when a woman was healed by touching the hem of Jesus' garment (Mt 9:18-26) and when cloths touched by St. Paul were used to heal the sick and drive out demons (Acts 19:12)."

The website further explains that a more developed use of relics began during the persecution of the early Church, when the faithful would retrieve the bones of martyrs and place them under the altar for Mass. To this day, Catholic churches place first-class relics in altar stones. The heart of St. Jean Vianney was taken from the saint's body after his death in recognition of his burning love for God and humanity. It has remained intact, or incorrupt, for more than 150 years. The heart is encased in a 17th-century French reliquary.

St. Jean Vianney, also known as the "Curé of Ars," or "pastor" of Ars, France, is the patron of parish priests. According to the Knights of Columbus website, it is especially meaningful for the Knights to host the relic of the patron of parish priests, since the Order was founded in 1882 by a holy parish priest, Father Michael McGivney. Father McGivney's cause for sainthood is open at the Vatican, which has bestowed on him the title of Venerable, in recognition of his heroic virtue.

A painting, or religious icon, was commissioned by the Knights of Columbus for the tour. The original was painted by Italian iconographer Fabrizio Diomedi, and copies were made to accompany the relic.

The Knights of Columbus are supporting the cost for the St. Jean Vianney Relic Pilgrimage. Donations made through the site will be sent to the St. Jean Vianney Shrine in Ars for capital improvement. The shrine is renovating its welcome center, and donations may be made at https://www.kofc.org.

The Ultrasound Initiative Program Saves Lives of Unborn Babies

More than 2,000 lives of unborn babies have been saved as a result of the Nebraska Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative Program.

Since 2009 the Nebraska Knights of Columbus Culture of Life Foundation (COL) has placed a total of ten ultrasound machines in qualifying Women's Resource Centers throughout Nebraska. The first one was placed in Kearney in 2009. Others have been placed in North Platte, Grand Island, Hastings, O'Neill, and in four facilities in the Omaha area.


We asked the eight facilities (two machines were placed in 2018), with ultrasound machines in place by January 2017 the question; "In 2017, how many abortion minded and/or abortion vulnerable women received an ultrasound, and after seeing the results, chose not to abort?" With seven of the eight facilities responding, the total number of ultrasounds given was 2,463. Of that number, 2,027 women chose not to abort after viewing the ultrasound.

The COL is funded mainly through the One Rose-One Life campaign that is sponsored and carried out by local Knights of Columbus Councils in parishes statewide on or near January 22, the anniversary of the 1973, Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision.

The "Ultrasound Initiative," is a program started in 2009, by the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council, which has close to two million members, to help place ultrasounds machines in qualifying Women's Resource Centers throughout the United States and worldwide. Supreme typically pays half of the cost of a machine with the other half coming from the state or local Councils. Since its conception, close to 1,000 ultrasound machines have been placed, saving countless babies lives.
